Community Speed Watch

9. Discuss Parish Council Publicity. There is a request for more information to be put into the Stillington News as to the Business of the parish council, it was agreed that the Chairman and the Clerk look into the matter.

Hi son Arthur died of Illness during WW1. Two children Dennis Woodward and Edna Hugill were Chosen to help plant the tree because their birthdays were close to the Silver Jubilee. DR and Mrs Hughes, Edwina Newman and his sister in law Miss Mary Maskill were the committee who raised funds for the oak.

Cliff Simm was thanked for his work in researching the information and will be working with Michael Turvey to produce an inscription of words to place on the tree for passed and future commemoration.
