
Duke of Edinburgh students continue to help with village maintenance as part of their Community/ Volunteering Service Awards.

Tuesday 18th March. A fine spring morning after a heavy white frost like many nights recently. Spring is breaking out steadily, now the Snowdrops have finished having given a wonderful display and now the Daffodils are giving their best, along with the Celandines. I noticed that there appears to be a lot of blind ones (without flowers) on the Stillington banks. We planted two rows on either side of the drive up to the farm; one row always flowers well, though overgrown by fruit trees, grass and blackberries to my shame! The other row, where the fencing is moved to protect them, do not flower well at all and have not done so for a number of years.

I wait for the sounds of migrating birds but not much to report. I usually hear Curlew flying north and west to the Pennines but not a note to be heard. The poor Curlew, with its long beak and fine melody of piping on warm summer days is so wonderful to hear, is another bird whose numbers are dwindling.

Yesterday we had two visits of a male Sparrowhawk, probably having a look at the bird feeders. They are feeders but not for raptors. Of course, raptors are beautiful birds to look at, but we do need some means of controlling their numbers, beside the availability of food. More little birds, more predation followed by a decline in little bird numbers, are ever hungry for food and amenity with the need for more building. This fine male was slate-grey with barred white underparts, and of course, a master of flight.

I saw an interesting stone recently, of considerable size. The softer stone was covered with lichen, where there was little evidence of it on the harder and denser rock. Lichens are one of the oldest living organisms in our world and were amongst the first forms of life. The lichen is the older part of a team where they absorbed every drop of water they could find on the surface of the rock but could not develop until algae came and utilised the light and sun to photosynthesise into food for the lichens to become what they are today. Each is dependent on the other for an astonishingly long life of hundreds of years. We will soon be revelling in the wonder and colour of our gardens, which we will enjoy. However, also look at the beautiful trees as buds burst and flowers emerge for the busy bees. Enjoy them all as they grace our land again.
