Stillington Local Walks

Walk 6

Stillington Bus Walk Wigginton Lane End

Type of walk:

A walk which uses the local Reliance bus service to take you to the start of the walk. The walk then returns you to the village.

Distance:

Approximately 8½ miles (14 km)

Allow 3½ hours walking time

Grade:

easy walking – the route is flat and reasonably well waymarked, though there is one part where the path shown on the map has been ploughed up by the farmer but walkers seem to be restoring the path by walking across the field

A bus walk from Stillington

The main bus stop is in the village at the top of York Road. Free bus time-tables are available at Stillington Post Office & Stores or on-line.

Bus departure times (January 2015):

Monday - Saturday:

20 minutes past the hour 9:20 - 17:20.

Sundays and Bank Holidays:

10:10 12:10 14:10 16:10

The Journey is approximately 20 minutes.

A

Get off the bus at Wigginton Lane End and cross the road to the bridleway signed - Moor Lane $\frac{3}{4}$ mile.

Follow the bridleway and turn left after passing through the second of two gates, follow the path along the left side of two fields, then turn right to continue to the road.

B

Turn right and walk along the road (some traffic) passing the Forest of Galtres Golf Club. Moorlands Reserve is about half a mile distant. From Moorlands (worth a look if you don't have a dog and a good place for a picnic!) walk a short distance to the road junction.

C

Cross the road into Plainville Lane (signposted) directly opposite. Then walk and just keep walking, passing Brown's Garden Centre and the former Jacobean Hotel on the way. There is some traffic on the track, nothing excessive, so just watch/listen out for it. At the end of four miles of pleasant countryside through the area delightfully known as Bohemia, the road opens out onto Skates Lane, near Huby Village.

D

Turn right at the end of Brownmoor Lane, walking along Skates Lane until reaching Sutton and Huby Cemetery after about half a mile.

E

Just past the cemetery is an unmarked, but well used, right of way which leads across the fields. Eventually you reach a stile (with a dog gate) go over the stile onto the bridleway (Ox Close Lane). Turn right and walk about two hundred yards turning left at the path junction towards the buildings of Ravensdale Farm.

F

The path comes out on to the road near the farm house. Follow the road up the hill, bearing right at the junction, along Roseberry to the junction with York Road. Turn left at the junction and walk back into Stillington Village.
